Libraries aren't just repositories for old books and hives of children programs with the little ones and their parents buzzing in and out the doors. They're much more than that – but old stereotypes can be difficult to overcome.

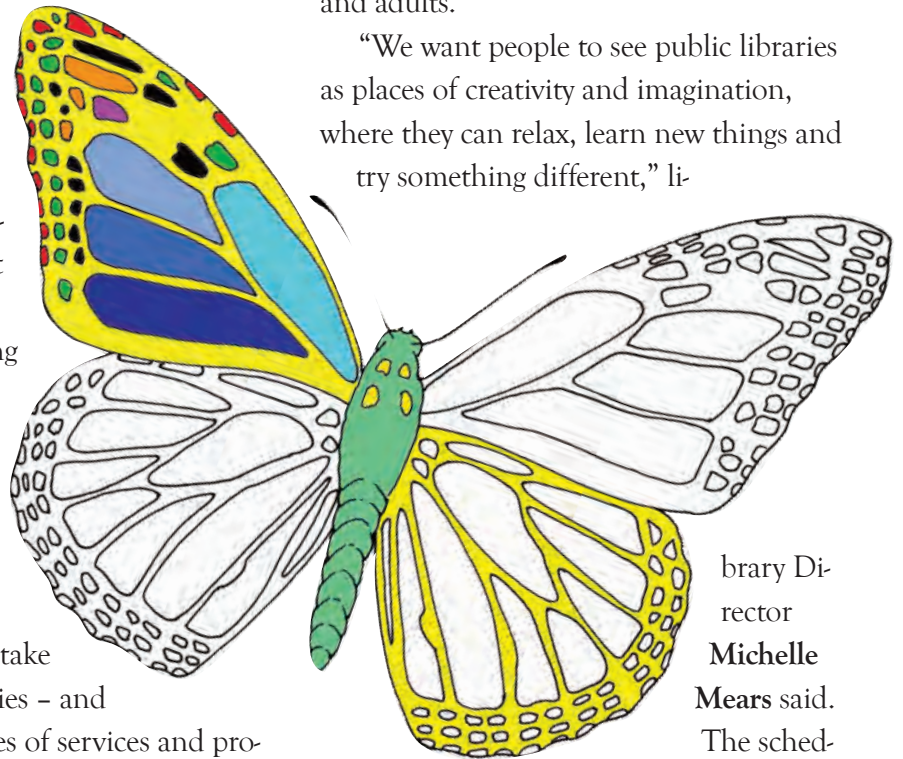
That's why Rolling Hills Library is joining more than 160 libraries in the United States, Canada and Australia this month in urging the public to take a fresh look at libraries – and see the various shades of services and programs libraries offer.

"Outside the Lines" is a weeklong celebration Sept. 13-19 to highlight the innovation happening in libraries. Its goal is to show how they are vibrant centers for learning, exploring, dreaming and community building.

effort is "Color Your World ... Outside the Lines," a series of programs for children and adults.

### Overnight Cinnamon Pecan Coffee Cake

Streusel Topping

$\frac{3}{4}$  cup packed brown sugar

$\frac{1}{2}$  cup chopped pecans

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

Coffee Cake

$\frac{3}{4}$  cup butter, softened

1 cup white sugar

2 large eggs

2 cup flour

## The Cake Lady

1 teaspoon baking powder

1 teaspoon baking soda

1 teaspoon nutmeg

$\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon salt

1 cup sour cream

To prepare streusel topping, combine sugar, pecans and cinnamon in a small bowl.

To prepare coffee cake, beat butter and sugar until light and fluffy; add eggs, one at a time beating after each addition and combined. In a separate bowl,

combine flour, baking powder, baking soda, nutmeg and salt. Add flour mixture to egg mixture, alternating with sour cream and ending with flour mixture. Beat until blended.

Spread batter into a greased 13x9 inch baking pan. Sprinkle streusel topping over batter. Cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate 8-18 hours.

Bake coffee cake in a pre-heated 350-degree oven for 35 minutes or until toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Can be served warm or at room temperature. Serves 12.
